SAINT OF THE WEEK - May 16th

St. Simon Stock was born on May 16, 1165. It is believed he was from Aylesford near Kent, England. Nothing is known of his family and early life there, and no exact date is known when he joined the Carmelite Order. The Carmelite Order originated from Jewish Christian hermits that embraced the prophet Elijah and lived in Palestine in caves on Mt. Carmel shortly after the death of Christ. From this origin, the order takes its identity. This group of Christians endured there for many centuries until the Third Crusade failed to break the Muslim stronghold. Many in this group fled Palestine at this time to finally escape persecution and death by scattering to several places in Europe (notably France, England and Ireland). Those pilgrims sought approval for their way of life from Rome around 1185 and were considered a mendicant group formally known as The Order of the Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel, and Simon was an early friar in this newly organized charism. Simon was elected as either the fifth or sixth prior general of the order around 1256. He was known for holiness during his life and also lived an ascetic life, eating only herbs, roots wild apples and drinking only water. He takes his surname "Stock" from the time he lived in a hollowed out tree trunk. In prayer, Simon sought a sign from Mary indicating Her approval of the Carmelite way of life. His intense prayer led to a vision where Mary appeared to him holding a brown scapular. Her promise to Simon was: "This is the privilege I give to vou and all Carmelites that whosoever shall die wearing this scapular shall never suffer the pains of hell." Simon died in Bordeaux, France in 1265 and was never formally canonized, but takes his sainthood from colloquial tradition.
